✓ Review of last week
Chapter 2:1-13 – Spirit Received / Baptism of Holy Ghost
✓ Receiving the Spirit (vv. 1-4)
There is a particular significance of the believers being in unity. The phrase "with one accord" appears 12 x in the N.T.
When God's people are united, the common denominator is resting in and/or waiting on God's promises – this brings blessings.
Note: Every other time the phrase "with one accord" shows up, it relates to the unified rejection of God's word – this brings violence.

Acts 2 refers to a holy feast known as Pentecost. It was one of the seven holy feast days given by God to the Hebrews in Leviticus 23.

Trumpets	Seventh month, 1 st day of month, ordered to have a special Sabbath; memorializing the blowing of trumpets; called the field-workers into the temple (to stop working and worship); represents the rapture	Lev. 23:24; Lev. 25:8-10;		
Atonement	On the 10 th day of the 7 th month; A day of confession, the highest of holy days; represents the 2 nd coming	Lev. 23:27		
Tabernacles	15 th day of 7 th month; a celebration of the shelter God provided to the Hebrews and will provide throughout eternity 'post-2 nd coming'	Lev. 23:24
